Water Skiing or Wake Boarding

Enjoy water skiing or wake boarding on a near by lake Monday through Friday. Competent instructors will be sharing their talents on the camp's ski boat. Campers need to be 10 years old or older and pass a swimming test at camp. Outdoor camping may be experienced and/or the campers will be back at camp for supper and evening program. Dates: Water Skiing is the week of Junior 4, July 23-30. Wake Boarding is the week of Tween, July 30-August 6. This specialty class is \$125 extra.

Horsemanship Class

Campers will learn to become real "cowboys" as they learn western riding skills and care for "their" horse during the week. This is for those 10 years of age and above only. This specialty class is \$80 extra. Closed-toe shoes and long pants must be worn by campers who take this class.

Horsemanship Gymkhana

Experienced riders will find this class challenging and fun. Skills in an obstacle course will be presented. An experienced wrangler from a local horse stable will be the instructor. This specialty class is \$80 extra.

Gymnastics

By popular demand, this class will be presented this summer! The campers will be taught basic tumbling and gymnastic techniques. This class is \$25 extra.

Snorkeling

This class is for campers who have passed the intermediate swimming course. Snorkeling basics will be taught in the camp's pool to equip them for open waters. An experienced, certified scuba diver will be teaching this class. Bring your own snorkel (and fins) if you possess them. This specialty class is \$25 extra.

Ceramics

Several vases, bathroom accessories and figurines can easily be made in this class. Skilled teachers will assist campers in cleaning, painting, and firing their very own ceramic project. This specialty class is \$55 extra.

Sports Camp

Experienced instructors will teach the following: Soccer, basketball, volleyball and field sports. A minimum of 10 campers needed weekly for these classes to be taught.

Swimming

Learn beginning and intermediate swimming skills in our splendid swimming pool.

Balloon Art

Learn to make animals and other items from long balloons. This class is offered only once a week for 3 to 4 hours. Campers will receive a hand pump, 24 balloons, personal instruction and loads of fun for all ages. This specialty class is \$15 extra.

Beginners Backpacking

An introduction to backpacking with hikes and an overnight trip. Equipment will be supplied. Open to ages 10 years and above. Dates: Week of Junior 2, July 9-16. This specialty class is \$25 extra.

Optical Illusion

One weekly 3 to 4 hour class taught by Pete McCloud. Campers will learn over 50 tricks, puzzles, and surprises that can be used at home, school or church. This specialty class is \$10 extra and for all ages.

Art Class

The campers will be encouraged to express their creativity through the different forms of art. This specialty class is \$10 for supplies.

Guitar Lessons

An experienced teacher will teach daily Guitar lessons. Students are encouraged to bring their own guitar as the camp has only 6. Students will play during the song services during worship time. This specialty class is \$10 extra.

Teen Leadership Training

Teens between 16-17 years of age may take this class. They will be Junior staff in leadership roles. This prepares the campers to become a camp staff when they are 18 years old. Teen Camper MUST have an interview with Camp Director before Camp Week is chosen. Call 818-546-8439. The total cost for the week is \$275.

Camp Information

The basic camp cost for a week is \$250. If fees and application is received by the Youth Ministries Department on or before June 2 you will receive a free gift. There are extra fees for specialty classes as listed below.

There are over 10 different areas of activities presented daily including the specialty classes.

If one chooses the basic rotation, the camper will rotate through areas including some of the specialty classes. Specialty classes will meet daily for 2-3 hours in the morning emphasizing their choice. After the Specialty class, the camper may choose other activities of their interest.

Laundry is available for those staying more than one week for an extra fee of \$10 per wash & dry.

Six exciting camps are planned for young people ages 6 to 16: Adventurer camp (6-9), Junior camp (8-12), and Tween camp (12-16). Adventurer camp will feature basic rotations and 3 specialty classes listed with * on application. For Junior & Tween camps specialty classes, see list on application. Finances

The camp fee for one week of exciting fun is \$250. This fee covers food, program, accident insurance, and camper care. A free gift will be given if application and full payment is received by the Youth Ministries Department on or before June 2. An additional \$10 laundry charge per week is made for campers staying more than a week. Mail completed application with full payment (certified check or money order) to: Southern California Conference, P.O. Box 969, Glendale, CA 91209-0969. When making a payment in person, you may pay with cash. A receipt will be sent promptly. After June 15, please mail application with full payment to Camp Cedar Falls, P.O. Box 1134, Angelus Oaks, CA 92305. Three week's notice (before attendance) is necessary to receive a refund. A \$50 processing fee will be retained. ALL REFUNDS WILL BE ISSUED AFTER SEPTEMBER 1. No refund after a camper arrives at camp.

Visitors are welcome by arrangement only with the Camp Director. Meals are available for a nominal charge. PLEASE NO VISITORS ON SATURDAY.
